Community Involvement in Plan Development

Challis Elementary and Challis Jr. Sr. High School have leadership committees with parent participation. These committees have developed and update the School Wide Improvement Plan each year. Stanley Elementary and Jr. High School have monthly meetings with the parent association to discuss academic concerns and develop plans for academic growth.

Challis Elementary and Stanley Elementary/Jr. High schools meet with parents after initial testing in math and reading to develop education plans for students. This first conference is scheduled for mid-September. At this conference teachers discuss test results and how the students, parents and teachers can work collaboratively to support each student in making academic gains. This first conference will develop each students' literacy plan along with other academic plans. Throughout the year meetings will be held with parents as well as the two regularly scheduled parent-teacher conferences to adjust the plans as needed.

Challis Jr. Sr. High school meets with each student 7-12 grade to develop a plan toward graduation requirements and a pathway for success in the chosen career field after graduating. The parents will be included in a face-to-face meeting with their child to have a clear understanding of this plan. Challis Jr. Sr. High school will also work with community members, parents, staff, and students to create a profile of a graduate for Challis High School.

Section VI: Report of Progress Narrative

Successes

Challis School District was able to conduct face to face instruction throughout the 2020-2021 school year. The start of the school year was a little rough with some initial quarantine, but staff and students worked through technology issues and ensuring students received proper instruction. All three schools used benchmark testing through the year to monitor student growth or needs in math and reading K-12.

2020-2021 Performance Targets Met

The performance targets we set for Istation and ISAT were not met, but we did increase the percentage of students testing proficient on the ISATs from the Spring 2019 test. One class in the elementary had achieved 100% of the student's showing growth from the fall to the spring Istation test.

Planned Strategies to Address Areas of Challenge

The district is transitioning into mastery education. Teachers will identify essential standards needed to pass the grade level or subject area. This focus will give each teacher the opportunity to support students at their academic level and collaborate to keep students on track toward proficiency. Tiered interventions have been incorporated during the school day to support students who are near or below grade level.
